Dr. Kluka was elected to the Board of Commissioners for her second term. Dr.

Kluka is presently Dean of the School of Human Performance and Leisure Sciences and Full Professor of Sport Management in the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences at Barry University. She has been an Extraordinary Professor at the University of Pretoria, South Africa in the Department of Sport and Leisure Studies and continues to be a member of the sport leadership development team for the Malawi National Sports Council. She is presently part of the international faculty at the University of Beira Interior, Portugal, in their international sport science master's degree program. She has published three texts, over 125 articles, and has presented professional/research papers in five continents.

Darlene has been recognized as an international scholar and leader throughout her 42-year career, of which she has dedicated her energy



and enthusiasm to the advancement of women and sport science. Dr. Fried is serving his second term on the BOD as the Finance Director and is a professor of Sport Management and chair of the Sport Management Department at the University of New Haven, where he has taught for 15 years. His specialties are sport law, sport finance and sport facility management. Gil's sport facility management textbook is entering its 3rd edition and has been translated into more than five languages and is used at over 140 sport management programs in the United States alone. His sport finance textbook is also in its 3rd edition and he is coming out with a sport analytics textbook in 2016.

He was a college coach for a number of years before pursuing his Master's and Law degrees while coaching at the Ohio State University. After completing his law degree, Gil was a practicing attorney in San Francisco where he engaged in insurance defense work and started the Sport Law Center. ## COSMA News and Notes

### COSMA BOD Extends Voting Rights

The Board of Directors, with input from students and faculty, recently changed the voting rights of two membership groups defined in COSMA's By-Laws. The changes afford Student Members the right to vote in COSMA matters and extend voting privileges to each full-time faculty member in a program. Instead of one vote per program, all current full-time faculty will be eligible to vote. Voting generally occurs in April during elections, but if any other matters require feedback from the membership, both students and full-time program faculty will be able to participate.

### International Textbook Forthcoming

Keep your eyes open for a new and innovative textbook entitled: *Managing Sport Across Borders*. The text will focus on the dichotomy of sport management (commercial sport management perspectives and social justice perspectives) and will be an essential text for developing a global mindset for international sport management. A co-editor is COSMA's own Darlene Kluka of the BOC and Barry University and a chapter author will be another COSMA star, Dr. Collen Colles of the Metropolitan State University of Denver. Congratulations to them both and we anxiously await publication!

### Tampa 2017: 3rd Annual COSMA Conference

COSMA's 3rd Annual Conference is on! Hosted once again by the University of Tampa, the conference is scheduled for February 9-10, 2017. Based on attendee feedback, next year's conference will include "tracks" including: Student engagement (e.g., best practices in teaching), COSMA accreditation process training (with a focus on recent manual changes) and presentations linking academics and practitioners. ### Updated Accreditation Manuals: Impacts on You

COSMA has three main accreditation documents that govern the accreditation process. The **Site Visit Preparation Manual** (December 2015) provides you with a step-by-step review of the site visit process and cites procedural requirements and timelines as well as provides samples and examples of what to expect if you are hosting a site visit or are a site reviewer. Changes and additions include valuable appendices: the site reviewer resource guide, copies of the evaluations that programs and evaluators complete to provide feedback and a template of the site visit team report.

The **Accreditation Process Manual** (December 2015) was also revised to provide greater specificity in some areas and to align with CHEA standards. New sections include degree/accreditation mills, explanation of procedural flexibility for non-U.S.-based programs, public notification of accreditation decisions and a longer and more detailed public disclosure section. Public disclosure refers to how accreditation decisions are made public by COSMA and how accredited programs are required to refer to their accreditation status to the public. The section also provides detailed guidance on the type of information required to be published regarding student achievement. It is this last item that has been and will continue to be highlighted in future training.

This manual also outlines "Administrative Probation" – a status that closes a previous gap in situations when an accredited program does not follow reporting or fiscal requirements. A new section toward the end of the document outlines how COSMA would handle any conflict that could arise between its policies and procedures and any national, state or local laws. The mentoring program section remains for anyone to utilize and a list of current mentors is available upon request. Appendices complement the new detailed requirements for public disclosure by including a template to assist programs in knowing what data should be available to the public.

Last, but not least, the **Accreditation Principles and Self Study Preparation Manual** (May 2016) has a number of shifts within it that are important for programs to take

note of. The first is a greater emphasis on integration between outcomes assessment and the strategic plan and planning processes. In addition, the self study guidelines more clearly ask programs to discuss the effectiveness of outcomes assessment and strategic planning processes (i.e., "closing the loop"). The common professional component (CPC) areas were modified to reflect current changes and trends in the field; a strong emphasis on integrative experiences and career planning is highlighted. Definitions of each CPC area are provided, as are examples to help you better know how to classify topical areas taught in your classes.

The faculty qualifications table includes the area(s) of assigned teaching and the program coverage table also includes at which level (bachelor's, master's, doctoral) faculty are teaching. Many people will be happy that the scholarly and professional activities table has been eliminated! In its place is a narrative of the scholarly and professional activities of both full-time and part-time/adjunct faculty members. As with outcomes assessment and strategic planning, the program is asked to reflect upon the degree to which the focus of faculty activities supports academic quality. Questions about internships are woven into the business and industry linkages principle to highlight best practices in internship programs. Programs are still expected to focus internationally and on diversity. More guidance is provided on the type of indicators that may demonstrate "external accountability" of student achievement. All accredited programs are required to provide this data to the public on their website, and instructions for how to do so are in Principle 7.7.

As you can see, the same principles guide programs toward continuous improvement, with changes made in response to industry and higher education changes and based on your feedback, the "users" of accreditation! All programs will transition from the "old" to the "new" document over time and the Board of Commissioners has set guidelines for this transition and will work with individual programs, as needed. Stay tuned for a variety of training and Q&A sessions on the revised accreditation documents.
