

**Assistant Professor (Tenure-Track)**

Huntingdon College, Montgomery, Alabama, seeks applications for the position of *Assistant Professor of Sport Management*. This is a full-time, tenure-track faculty position, requiring a 24 credit-hour load (typically four courses per semester) of face-to-face teaching. The successful applicant will teach a range of courses contributing to majors in Sport Management and related fields in Sport Science. The position begins August 1, 2025.

The strongest applications will demonstrate excellence in teaching and a commitment to ethical behavior and professionalism, student mentorship, scholarly and professional engagement, and campus citizenship. Huntingdon College is committed to building a culturally diverse faculty and strongly encourages applications from minority candidates.

**Required Qualifications:** an earned PhD in Sport Management or a closely related discipline. Masters-prepared candidates and ABDs nearing completion will be considered for an Instructor-level position; appointment to the tenure track requires completion of the terminal degree.

**Preferred qualifications:** Experience teaching undergraduates (especially freshmen and first-generation college students), excellent interpersonal skills, desire to contribute to the growth of a successful program. Candidates with significant college-level teaching experience may be eligible for credit toward tenure.
