Wayne State University's Division of Kinesiology, Health, and Sport Studies seeks a 1.0 FTE Lecturer (non-tenure track) to teach and advise in the Sport Management undergraduate program and the Sports Administration online graduate program.

The College of Education at Wayne State University is located in the heart of Detroit's rapidly revitalizing Midtown area. The college is seeking a lecturer in Sports Administration and Sport Management to provide leadership in executing its mission to "prepare effective urban educators and scholars who are reflective, innovative, and committed to diversity." Wayne State University is a Carnegie Tier 1 research university, and one of 34 public urban research universities in the U.S. with a strong commitment to urban education. Responsibilities:

- Teaching face-to-face and online courses in the Sport Management undergraduate and Sports Administration graduate programs.
- Advising undergraduate and graduate students related to coursework, internships, and career preparation.
- Supervise internship and fieldwork placements in related sports industry positions.
- Assisting divisional and program faculty and administrators with student recruitment and retention initiatives, program assessment, supporting adjunct faculty, establishing field/practicum experience sites, and other duties required to meet organizational needs.
- Serving on departmental and college-wide committees.
